Rabbi's Message

A Month to Prepare

This year, the month of September overlaps substantially with the Hebrew month of Elul, our month of preparation for the High Holy Days. If our congregation had daily minyans, we would hear shofar blasts every day (except Shabbat) throughout the month, as a wake-up call to do the work of Elul.

The work of Elul is the work of introspection. Even the first level of introspection is challenging: What have I done well, what have I gotten right this year that I should be sure to bring into the next year and build upon that strength? Where have I erred? When



I have erred, how have I hurt myself, other individuals, the Jewish people, or God? From whom do I need forgiveness?

The second level is even tougher for many of us. Who has hurt me? What have I done to resolve this painful situation? Am I carrying a grudge? Can I safely move towards reconciliation? Will I be better off if I extend forgiveness, even if it is not deserved?

Towards the end of the month of Elul, our tradition gives us two opportunities to sharpen this work. The first is called Selichot, which means "pardons" or "prayers for forgiveness." We gather on the Saturday night before Rosh Hashanah (September 28) and start our prayers for God's forgiveness. But before our prayers, we will learn together about the benefits of engaging in forgiveness, from the two perspectives of modern science and ancient tradition.

Our second opportunity is called Kever Avot. We go to our local Jewish cemeteries and pray for our beloved dead whose remains are buried there. For those of us who have no one buried here in the Quad Cities, we go to support the mourners and to remember our own cherished people. There is nothing like honoring the dead to remind us of how they would want us to live, what their highest hopes were for us, and that can be an amazing spur to our work of introspection.

As I prepare for the High Holy Days, one of the things on my mind is what remembrance we owe to those who perished last October 7, as well as those who perished since then in the Gaza War. So that you can plan ahead, let me inform you now that the sanctuary will be open on October 7 with a memorial candle burning, so that you may come and pray or meditate. In addition, I will be adding remembrances to our liturgy for the day of Yom Kippur. I will share more precise information about that addition to our services shortly.

I wish you all a deeply meaningful month of Elul as we look towards sharing deeply meaningful High Holy Day services. Wake up!

This event will celebrate the lives and achievements of 8 members of our community and will be portrayed by costumed volunteers who will tell the story of some of our community's most memorable citizens.





In Jewish tradition there are stages of mourning, which help a person through the process of grieving. Many synagogues, including ours, also have customs that help facilitate remembering your loved one.

Yahrzeit plaques serve to honor the memory of a loved one and ensure their name will be read before mourner's kaddish, even after relatives move or pass away. The plaque made of bronze will hang in a place of honor upon the dedicated Memorial Wall located inside Beit Shalom. To order a yahrzeit plaque, please call the office and provide the English name, Hebrew name and date of death.
